Dear FPC Family

As we usher in a new year, I'd like to share a few items of church news with you. We continue to see God's hand at work in providing for and leading his church.

We have laid out a full year of sermons, and some of them involve an integration of our discipleship and worship components. The sexuality series of January and February is enhanced by a four week J-term sexuality class team taught by Ron Cepek, Martha Schartner and myself. During Lent, a prayer series will parallel men's and women's groups (and

others who join us) who will dedicate Lent to prayer. Then, starting in the fall, we will feature "The Story," an all church resource that touches all ages, Sunday School, small groups, preaching...to tell the story of the Bible (fall, 2024 – summer, 2025). We believe that by pairing preaching and discipleship, what we learn from these explorations will be greatly enhanced.

We continue our search for a full-time Director of Student Ministries. We have strong candidates and the search is forging ahead. We hope to be able to find the person to lead our youth as soon as possible. Meanwhile, our strong core of volunteer leaders will be supplemented by the leadership of Joye Hagen at the Senior High level, and Dave Mateer at the Junior High level. We are confident that this wonderful work will continue.

We also continue our search for a Contemporary Music Director. Susan Grimm, who has taken the Interim role for us before, is guiding our praise team and this service as we forge ahead. Again, we are so blessed to have a dedicated team, the Praise Team, in place and serving capably.


Say What?? Grace Filled Conversation about Sexuality

As we look back on this trip, we are reminded that God is sovereign over the whole earth. It's been a year since a team has traveled the Pond to spend time with the Phillip House kids and Ovidiu. And in a year so much has happened. Ovidiu's wife, Viorica, passed away, new kids and their families joined the PH community, the big blue van is gone (unsafe), new volunteers help at the PH, and more. And through it all God has been right there providing and comforting and preparing hearts.

We were fortunate to meet a woman with a beautiful heart. She is a family friend to Ovidiu and his wife, growing up in the same village Viorica grew up in. Two years ago she moved to Bucharest to help with Viorica while she was sick. Even though the loss of Viorica added to the trauma she was already dealing with, she decided to stay in Bucharest after Viorica's passing. As we heard this story, it was impossible to not see how God had been at work in each of their lives. Bringing stability and love into the young woman's life and creating a new family for Ovidiu after Viorica was gone. This was an answer to prayer for those of us who were concerned about him being alone.

We praise God, our Almighty King and Sovereign Lord, keeper of promises and healer of heart. We, as a team went, expecting our hearts to be moved and changed by the children we met







and spent time with. But God saw fit to show us He is bigger than anything we could imagine. He is bigger than the plans we make, bigger than the gifts we give and just plain bigger than us.

Journeying Through Grief

If you have lost a loved one or know someone who has, the "Journeying Through Grief" books may help. As well as talking to a Stephen Minister. Throughout this year most of the articles from Stephen Ministry in the Compass have been walking through book one, "A Time to Grieve". This book is normally sent after three weeks after a loss. The second book is called, "Experiencing Grief". This book is sent 3 months after the loss. "Finding Hope and Healing" is the third book in the series and sent six months after the loss. The last book of the series is called, "Rebuilding and Remembering". These books focus on what a person is likely to be experiencing at that point in grief. The books also offer understanding, empathy, compassion, and hope.




